

T-SPLOST Fact Sheet

Regional T-SPLOST (2010, HB277)

- 18-County Region
- Regional T-SPLOST vote will occur in May 2018 if the Ware County single-county T-SPLOST fails on November 7, 2017
- NEW self-start provision by majority of counties in region (10)
 - Adoption of resolution, No state legislature action required
- Broad Definition of Eligible Projects
- Duration is 10 Years
- Roundtable and process for selecting projects remains the same
 - 36 members (county chairman, mayoral representative, no proxy)
 - Establish criteria, approve final list, call for referendum
 - Executive Committee
 - 5 members from roundtable, 3 from General Assembly
 - Draft the investment list, public meetings, feedback to roundtable
- If passed, GDOT LMIG match goes from 30% to 10%
- NEW fractional rate up to 1% in .05% increments
 - 75% to investment list projects (30% to SSTP projects)
 - 25% discretionary money goes back to each jurisdiction
- NEW 30% of revenues to be spent on statewide strategic transportation plan projects
 - To be defined, does not really list projects, rather broad types of projects

NEW Single County T-SPLOST (July 1, 2017) (HB134) (2015, HB170 and HB106)

- Referendum vote in Ware County: November 7, 2017
- Single Counties
 - Projects can cross county lines, but each county funds own portion, Intergovernmental Agreement is mechanism for partnership
- Fractional rate up to 1% in .05% increments
 - Up to 1% with Intergovernmental Agreement
 - With an Intergovernmental Agreement 30% of revenues are to be spent on statewide strategic transportation plan projects
 - To be defined, does not really list projects, rather broad types of projects
 - Up to .75% without Intergovernmental Agreement
- Max duration – 5 years
- 90% municipalization by area and 60% population provision (does not apply in SGRC area)
- Requires a county to meet and confer with municipalities
- Referendum is majority vote (50% + 1)
- Process for project list development similar to that of SPLOST
- Broad Definition of Eligible Projects
- Current SPLOST must be in effect at time of TSPLOST adoption not during duration
 - TSPLOST is not subject to the 2% local sales tax cap
- Cannot have Regional TSPLOST and County TSPLOST at the same time
